

Matches meet once a week up to one hour at the child's school. During their time, they work on school work, play games, and build social and peer relationship skills.

REACH Activities Program

Structured and professionally administered group activities to help youth improve academic performance and attitude, make healthy choices, and avoid risky behaviors. Activities focus on five key areas critical to youth development: Recreation, Education & Careers, Arts & Culture, Civic Engagement, and Health & Fitness. All REACH Activities are supported by the Golden Anchor Endowment Fund.

The Golden Anchor's Mission:

To encourage the local use of proven alternative methods of educating youth who are at risk of academic and/or social failure.



Bowl for Kids' Sake-March 2019

In honor of our 45th Anniversary, we had 48 bowling teams join us and embrace our 70's theme. They dressed up, raised generous pledges, and enjoyed cosmic bowling while listening



to classic rock each night. Thanks to our local businesses, service organizations, and community members, the event raised \$49,648 over the four nights. We love seeing our teams and volunteers come out once a year to ignite potential in Ozaukee youth.



Berry Big Run for the Kids—June 2019

With the sun shining, 477 smiling runners and walkers, and a bride and groom celebrating their anniversary, our 5K Run kicked off the Cedarburg Strawberry Festival. Thanks to our event sponsors, all of our participant's entry fees directly supported our youth mentoring programs. The Saturday morning



raised \$24,847 to help us recruit, screen, train, and match caring and safe mentors to youth eagerly waiting for a Big Brother or Sister.

Big Kampaign for Kids—November 2019

Our annual giving campaign directly supports our one-to-one mentoring programs both in the community and within our local schools. Over 80 individuals and businesses contributed anywhere



from \$15 to \$8,000 to positively impact our youth. The \$26,000 raised provides positive Big Brothers and Sisters that ignites, empowers, and defends potential in our children.

Outstanding Partner of the Year Harbor Hills Recreation Center



Harbor Hills owner, Bob Nisleit, is a man that likes to be behind the scenes, filling the bowling lanes with red pins, handing out bowling shoes, or serving up a drink at our Bowl for Kids' Sake. Though the tradition began with his mother, Rosie, it is Bob's annual gift that has kept this event strong. In addition to supporting our Bowl for Kids' Sake, Bob is always there loading and unloading tables, cases of water, and all of the supplies into his trailer for our Berry Big Run for the Kids. 
